

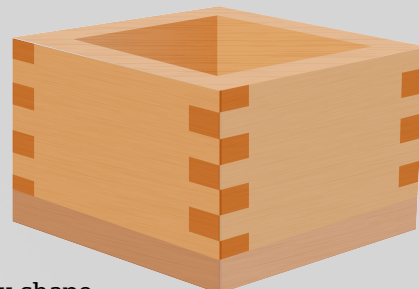
Sake Cups

Overview of Common Sake Cup Styles



Guinomi

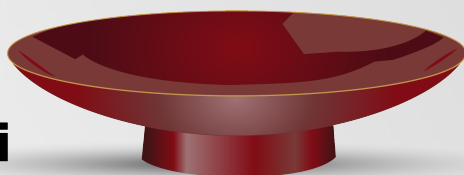
- Generally larger sized sake cups
- May have a rougher, organic texture and shape
- Common Material: Ceramic



Masu

- Square box shape
- Standard size: 180ml / 6 oz. in volume
- Common Material: Wood

Sakazuki



- Shallow, wide bowl shape.
- Often used for ceremonial purposes
- Common Materials: Wood/Lacquer, Metal



Kikichoko

- White cup with blue and white "janome" (snake eye) design inside
- Often used by industry and professional tasters
- Common Material: Ceramic



Kiriko Glass

- Faceted, ornate cut glass designs often colored blue or red
- Famously produced in Edo (Tokyo) & Satsuma (Kagoshima)
- Common Material: Glass



Footed Cup

- Both modern and historical designs
- Usually rounded cups with a raised foot
- Common Materials: Glass, Ceramic

Ochoko

- Generally smaller sized sake cup
- Often with a smooth texture and shape
- Common Materials: Glass, Ceramic, Metal, Wood/Lacquer
